METHADONE FACTS

One of methadone's most common uses is in helping people with opioid addictions to gradually detox and recover with the goal of ultimately ending their addiction and drug use entirely. What is methadone, and why do we use it to treat opioid addiction? Methadone is a synthetic opioid medication. Like other opioids including morphine, heroin, and buprenorphine, methadone affects how your body senses pain. However, it has a slower-acting and longer-lasting affect that makes it less addictive, longer-lasting, and ideal for long-term treatment.

HOW WE SERVE

Beyond Your Ordinary Treatment center aims to serve Henry County and the Greater Atlanta Area as an outpatient opioid clinic. Our treatment clinic is specifically designed for persons addicted to the opioid class of drugs, including prescription pain medications and heroin. FAQ'S

Q: Is Methadone Safe?

A: Any drug carries the potential for harmful interactions or overdose, and methadone is no exception. Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) using methadone has proven to be one of the safest ways to recover from serious addictions to opioid painkillers like heroin. As part of a narcotic replacement therapy program, each patient is treated individually and given careful supervision with regards to dosage and use of other medications with the potential for harmful interaction.

Q: How Long Does Treatment Last?

A: Your treatment program will be tailored to your individual needs. Some people's programs may end as quickly as a few months, while others may last over a year. MMTs are useful for people that are vulnerable to relapse and high-risk behaviors such as IV drug use, unsafe sexual behaviors, illegal activity, and overdose.

Q: What is Suboxone, And How Is It Used For Detoxification?

A: It contains a low dosage of the opioid agonists, which helps patients to start to discontinue the use of addictive opiates by decreasing the feelings of withdrawal symptoms. With the help of Naloxone it will then block the effect of the addictive properties that narcotics can contain. The Naloxone can act as a binder which will block receptors and can prevent addictive receptors from being activated. Suboxone is a great way to slowly start easing off addictive drugs. Persons served can use this as a way to start detoxifying and when they are going through withdrawal periods. Statistically many patients have seen great results with the help of Suboxone.
